SHOW RULES



PLEASE SEE CLASS WORDING FOR SPECIFIC RULES ON INDIVIDUAL CLASSES.

1. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
2. **JUDGING TIMES** are as accurate as possible at the time of printing, but it is advisable to check with the revised timetable nearer to the Show. Judging is in timetable order unless otherwise stated.
3. **FALL OF HORSE / RIDER** – a fall of horse or rider while mounted in any class will result in disqualification and they **MUST** leave the ring dismounted.
4. **LOOSE HORSES** – If an animal gets loose from its handler whilst in the Ring or during the Conformation phase of any Working Hunter / Working Hunter Pony class it will result in disqualification.
5. **CLOSING OF CLASS** – no exhibits will be permitted to enter the class once the gate is closed and the horses / ponies have been asked to trot.
6. **HATS** – correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps / Riding Hats that meet current BSI safety standards **MUST** be worn by all riders.
7. **BITS / BRIDLES** - In all classes, unless otherwise stated, any suitable bit is acceptable.
8. **EAR RINGS / PIERCINGS** – in the interest of safety, no ear rings, piercings or visible jewellery should be worn whilst competing.
9. **BODY PROTECTORS** – may be worn and are recommended whilst competing in WHP/WH classes.
10. **SPURS/DRESS SPURS** must **NOT** be worn in any Show Pony / Intermediate Working Hunter / Intermediate Show Hunter Type/Intermediate Show Riding Type/Show Hunter Pony/Working Hunter Pony, M&M-WHP or any Ridden Mountain and Moorland showing class.
11. **SHOW CANES** – are not to exceed 75cms (30"). Hunting crops are permissible.
12. **STALLIONS** – in the interest of safety, stallions may only be ridden / handled by persons over the age of **14 years** by the 1st January in the current year with the exception of Small Breeds Mountain & Moorland stallions when the rider / handler must have attained their **12th birthday** by the 1st January in the current year.
13. **COMPETITOR NUMBERS MUST BE WORN / CLEARLY** displayed at all times whilst mounted. This includes working in / exercising around the showground.

On Sunday 4th June, Gates will open at 6am. Please display gate passes clearly in your vehicle on the approach to the Showground.

MAIN RING

SPORT HORSE BREEDING (GB)

All Hunter classes will be judged under the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules 2023. Only horses registered on the current year's Show Hunter register are eligible to enter classes 1-4, 13 & 61 and Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be full members of the society. Classes 1-4, 13 & 61 can be registered on a **Day Ticket = £36** (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year at £36 per show– it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: Competitors must wear a skull cap or hat with safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard at all times. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. The two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Small and Ladies (side saddle) Classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. In the Amateur Hunter Classes, The lightweight section, the two highest placed smalls and the two highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the heavyweight section the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify

Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 13 & 61 ARE QUALIFIERS FOR THE ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW. (Entry fee includes £10.00 levy to RIHS)

- Class 1 **SHB(GB) LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER RIHS.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs).
- Class 2 **SHB(GB) MIDDLEWEIGHT HUNTER RIHS.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, capable of carrying 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs) and not exceeding 89kgs (14 stone).
- Class 3 **SHB(GB) HEAVYWEIGHT HUNTER RIHS.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone).
- Class 4 **SHB(GB) SMALL HUNTER RIHS.** Mare or gelding, 4 years old & over exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms.

HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 1 – 4 to compete.

RING 1

- Class 5 **UNAFFILIATED NOVICE RIDDEN HORSE** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms. Not to have won a first prize in any affiliated ridden horse class before 1st January in the current year.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION CLASSES – RIHS QUALIFIERS

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all owners, exhibitors and riders must be Association members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.** Classes 6-7, 8-9,10 & 11-12 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward. Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.–The highest placed unqualified exhibit in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of Season Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Shows in September 2023.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse and HOYS Hunter classes. The awards will go down the line; there is no limit on how many of these rosettes can be claimed in a year. Day Tickets. Non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per exhibitor, per horse per rider per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Novice, Amateur, Young Rider, Home Produced, Working, In hand and Open affiliated classes only but will not allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form or apply online from the BSHA website.

Class 6 **BSHA SMALL RIDING HORSE RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms.

Class 7 **BSHA LARGE RIDING HORSE RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 158cms.

RIDING HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 6 – 7 to compete.

Class 8 **BSHA LIGHTWEIGHT COB RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone.

Class 9 **BSHA HEAVYWEIGHT COB RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone.

COB CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 8 – 9 to compete.

Class 10 **BSHA MAXI COBS RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 155cms. To be judged as a Cob. All Maxi Cobs should be shown hogged.

Class 11 **BSHA SMALL HACK RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 154cms.

Class 12 **BSHA LARGE HACK RIHS** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 154cms but not exceeding 160cms.

HACK CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 11– 12 to compete.

Class 13 **SHB(GB) LADIES HUNTER RIHS** – mare or gelding, four years old or over to be ridden by a lady side-saddle.

BRITISH SHOW PONY ASSOCIATION (BSPS)

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes. Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify and the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE ponies placed in each class will qualify. Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

The BSPS Performance Coloured Classes are open to Graded Stallions, mares and geldings, 4 years old and over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA). Ponies can be registered with either of these Societies or the BSPS and owners and riders must be or become members within 7 days of the BSPS to take the qualification.

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS 015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards. MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. **Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory.** (BSPS is accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags).

METHOD OF JUDGING FOR CLASSES 14 – 18

Exhibitors will go found the ring as whole group, (no pull in). They will undertake a display (rather a than show) where they need to show certain movements which will include walk, including a walk on a free rein, trot, canter on both reins, a canter circle, canter transitions on the straight, extension in canter on one rein and a halt. Competitors in these classes will not be stripped.

Class 14 **BSPS JUNIOR PERFORMANCE PONY** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over not exceeding 128cms. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their **12th** birthday on the 1st January in the current year. Any suitable bridle, no cantering except in individual show.

Class 15 **BSPS PERFORMANCE PONY** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 148cm. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their **17th** birthday on 1st January in the current year.

Class 16 **BSPS PERFORMANCE PONY** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 158cm. Plaited ponies/horses. Riders any age.

Class 17 **BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NATIVE / COB / TRADITIONAL HORSE / PONY** – graded stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Riders any age. To be shown unplaited.

Class 18 **BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NON-NATIVE HORSE / PONY** – graded stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Riders any age. To be shown plaited.

PERFORMANCE CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 14 – 18 to compete.

RING 2

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION (BSHA) CLASSIFICATION

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION PRESENTS THE RISING STAR SHOWING FINALS

Direct-to-final and semi-final tickets available.

No membership is required to participate in the classes, but BSHA Rising Star membership must be purchased to attend the final. Performance led: A Show judge and a Conformation judge at the final. Qualifiers will run with a single judge and all participants will complete a timed freestyle show on the day.

BSHA AMATEUR CLASSIFICATION

To be classed as a BSHA Amateur, competitors must not:

- Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as means of deriving a main source of income.
- Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.
- Own / part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
- Show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, BSHA or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned.
- A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in any Open classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of Open Working Show Horse and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year.
- If an Amateur wishes to ride/compete on behalf of another Amateur, who is not an immediate family member, then this should be declared with the BSHA office who will decide whether to sanction the request or refer to the board for a decision. (This will not apply if a ride is offered by an Amateur that may have more than one horse in a Championship). If you do not disclose to the office that you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board, if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be

deemed professional and your amateur status will be revoked. In some instances, a 'Statement of Fact' will be required from the member on request of the Board.

- **Amateur Owner/Rider:** open to horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, (the rider need not be the owner of the horse). Horses either kept in a professional producer's yard or at home where a full, or part time, groom is employed. A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur Classes on an exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Producer or Groom (as deemed by the BSHA) in any OPEN classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of open working horse and side saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. On the day that a horse is competing in Amateur classes, non-amateurs, Professional Producers and Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are NOT allowed to compete the Amateur Exhibit, the same day in ANY classes (BSHA or otherwise). Because of the professional involvement, these horses may not compete in Home Produced Classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed to ride, work in (in any form), compete, or enter the ring to groom/strip the horse.
- **Amateur Home Produced:** open to horses that are either stabled at home or in a DIY yard (assisted livery accepted) and which since the 1st of January in the current year, have not been shown by a professional during the current season, or stabled in a professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur only. This does not exclude Amateur Home-Produced Riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. Amateur Home-Produced Horses are eligible for Amateur classes.
- No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the horse.

RULES

1. Available to **Amateur** BSHA members and non-members.
2. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at HOYS (not including SFAS, but to include SEIB R2R); or any open class at RIHS previously or in the current season (2023) and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the three years prior to and including the current season (not including SFAS).
3. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.
4. JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

Class 19 **BSHA RISING STAR LWT COB** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

Class 20 **BSHA RISING STAR HWT COB** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight Cob Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

Class 21 **BSHA RISING STAR MAXI COB** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 155cms, to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

Class 22 **BSHA RISING STAR HACK** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 160cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

No rider under 14 may exhibit a stallion in any class. No competitor / owner / horse may compete in this class or enter the ring without current 2023 Membership of BSPA and a RIHS qualification card. Qualification: 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class. No competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place. TATTERSALLS RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2024



Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The Series is open to AMATEURS only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the final. Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2024.

RoR Rosettes 1st – 4th RoR Prizes - 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st 2023. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and

riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show.

Class 46 **TATTERSALLS RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2024** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over.

Class 47 **OPEN RE-TRAINED RACE HORSE** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over.

RIDDEN ROR CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 46 – 47 to compete.

Class 48 **OPEN LEAD REIN** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 128cms. Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Snaffle bridles only. The lead rein to be attached to the noseband. Open to plaited and M&M ponies.

Class 49 **OPEN FIRST RIDDEN** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 128cms. Rider not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Any suitable bridle Open to plaited and M&M ponies.

Class 50 **OPEN RIDDEN PONIES** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 153cms. Any type. Rider any age.

OPEN RIDDEN PONY CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 48 –50 to compete.

WORKING HUNTER RING

Criteria for BSPS Heritage M&M Lead Rein Working Sports Pony:

The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. The reins **MUST** go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. The Leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

RIDERS: Hats in accordance with BSPS Rules, Tweed Jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, Shirt, tie, boots and gloves. No Buttonholes.

LEADERS: Country attire, Gentlemen - Trilby Hats or Caps, Ladies - modest hats.

Method of Judging:

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised. There will be **NO** conformation marks. Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed standards.

Marks:

Manners & style whilst performing the test (including jumping)	60 Marks
Type, movement and way of going	20 Marks
Presentation and suitability of pony for the rider	20 Marks

TOTAL: 100 Marks

Class 51 **BSPS HERITAGE M&M LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Registered Mountain and Moorland ponies not exceeding 128cms. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5th birthday on the 1st January in the current year and not to attain their 10th birthday in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle. In Lead Rein WSP classes the Judges will be looking for a pony suitable for a child to begin their future in Working Sports Pony classes. Height of fences approximately 30cms.

Class 52 **BSPS OPEN CRADLE STAKES** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 122cms. Rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences approximately 60cms.

- Class 53 **BSPS OPEN NURSERY STAKES** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 133cms. Rider no to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Height of fences approximately 75cms.
- Class 54 **UNAFFILIATED WORKING HUNTER PONY** – mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 153cms. Rider any age. Height of fences approximately 60cms.
- Class 55 **THE BSPS SUMMER WORKER STAKES** – plaited or M&M horses / ponies not exceeding 158cms, 4 years old & over. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Height of fences approximately 60cms.
- Class 56 **THE BSPS SUMMER WORKER STAKES** – plaited or M&M horses / ponies not exceeding 158cms, 4 years old & over. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Height of fences approximately 70cms.
- Class 57 **THE BSPS SUMMER WORKER STAKES** – plaited or M&M horses / ponies not exceeding 158cms, 4 years old & over. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Height of fences approximately 80cms.
- Class 58 **THE BSPS SUMMER WORKER STAKES** – plaited or M&M horses / ponies not exceeding 158cms, 4 years old & over. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Height of fences approximately 90cms.

SUMMER WORKING STAKES CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 55 –58 to compete.

- Class 59 **UNAFFILIATED WORKING HUNTER** – stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms. Rider any age. Height of fences approximately 80cms.
- Class 60 **BSHA RISING STAR WORKING SHOW HORSE** – stallion, mare or gelding (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail), 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

- Class 61 **TATTERSALLS ROR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE SHOW SERIES QULAIPIER 2023.** Mare or gelding 4 years old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2023. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must be registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. **The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, 26th August 2023.** The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged: 8 rustic jumps 3 foot (90cm) to 3 foot 3 inches (1 metre) with a maximum spread of 95cms). The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

- 10 points to be deducted for a knock down.
- 15 points to be deducted for a refusal.
- 20 points for second refusal.
- Elimination for third refusal or fall or error of course.

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. *(In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class).* Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes.



Show to include the following movements:

Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 3'6" (1.05 metre)

Prizes : Rosettes and Vouchers 1st to 3rd place.

Class 62 **BSHA RISING STAR OF WORKING HUNTER TYPE** – stallion, mare or gelding (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail), 4 years old & over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Final. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

SHB(GB) WORKING HUNTER – KINDLY SPONSORED BY MOBILETHRONES – RIHS – CLASS 61

Fences will be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft 9ins) at the discretion of the Judge. No change of tack or rider is allowed except if a side-saddle is used, then the saddle may be changed for the Judge. No change of tack or rider is allowed except if a side-saddle is used, then the saddle may be changed for the Judges ride. Exhibitors can now enter up to two horses in a Working Hunter class but following the jumping phase it will be up to the exhibitor to select only one horse to take forward into the ridden & conformation section if required. A skullcap or hard hat with safety harness and navy or black cover must be worn to current approved BSI or European standards during the jumping phase. No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring mounted or dismounted will be eliminated. Horses with minus scores may not be required for the second phase of the class at the discretion of the judge. Under no circumstances should a horse with a minus score be in a qualifying position. 40 points are awarded for Ride/Manners and Conformation.

Class 61 **SHB(GB) WORKING HUNTER – RIHS.** Stallion, mare or gelding (stallions to wear a red, white & blue ribbon displayed in their tail), 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms, Grade A showjumpers and advanced eventers are not eligible to compete in this class. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A showjumper or advanced event horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes.
